In case you missed it, Burnham have drawn a 3rd round tie at home against Punjab United (Step 5) in the Isuzu FA Vase. The game is to be played on Saturday 6th December 2025 - Kick-off is 3pm.

If this is your first visit, there is free parking inside the ground, with additional off-site parking available at nearby locations listed on our website and on page 4 of this programme. Please take care not to restrict traffic flow or block driveways if parking outside the ground.

We welcome visitors to the 1878 Stadium on a regular basis. For some it's a frequent return and for others it's their first time to the ground. The following information provides some useful guidance with links for more information.

The 1878 Stadium

Maximum capacity 2,500 including covered seating for 300 in the main stand. There is also a small, covered stand and a concrete path around the 3G pitch. Supporters are not allowed on the pitch and pitch invasions are not permitted.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF BURNHAM FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1878, Burnham Football Club is the second oldest club Buckinghamshire. We played in the early years, with considerable success, in various leagues, before joining the Great Western Combination in 1948. We moved to the Wycombe Combination in 1964 and then spent one season (1970/71) in the Reading Combination. In 1971 the club was elected to the Hellenic League. Winning both the Premier Division and League Cup in 1975/76. We were also twice beaten finalists in the League Cup too.

In 1977 the club were elected to the Athenian League and were twice runners-up before the league folded in 1984. We competed in the London Spartan League in 1984/85. Winning both the Premier Division title and the League Cup.

The summer of 1985 bought about the amalgamation of the football club with Hillingdon Borough FC, who had lost their ground and were about to fold. We played in the Southern League as Burnham & Hillingdon FC and reverted back to the former name of Burnham FC in 1987. Season 1994/95 saw us finish bottom. Resulting in relegation to the Hellenic League.

After 3 seasons in the Hellenic League, finishing fifth, third and again third in 1998/99. the club won both the Premier Division title and the League Cup. Therefore, gaining promotion back to the Southern Football League. The 2006/07 season saw us achieve our highest league position. Finishing 3rd and thus qualifying for the end of season Promotion Play-Off semi-final. Unfortunately losing to the eventual winners – Swindon Supermarine.

The 2012-2013 season was, without doubt, the most successful in the football club's history. The First Team won the Evo Stik League Southern Division One Central (Southern League) championship. Earning promotion to the newly sponsored Calor League Premier Division (Southern League), while our Reserves won the UHLSPORT Hellenic League Division Two East championship at the first time of asking. Earning promotion to Division One East where they came up against the First Teams of many of the previous season's opposition.

CUP COMPETITION HISTORY

In cup competitions Burnham reached the Quarter Final of the FA Vase in 1977/78 and then went one better in reaching the Semi Final in 1982/83. Losing 4-2 over two legs to Halesowen Town. The clubs record attendance of 2400 was achieved in the home leg. We have twice reached the Third Qualifying round of the FA Cup and in 2005/06 we reached the First Round Proper for the first time ever, before losing at home to Aldershot Town. In the F.A.Trophy we reached the Fourth Round (the last 16) in 1999/2000. Before losing to Scarborough in a replay after a creditable 1-1 draw at The Gore. In the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup we reached the Semi Final twice before losing on both occasions to Chesham United.

On the 22nd May 2024 the blues were successful in beating Virginia Water 2-1 at the Racecourse Ground (Ascot United) and won the 2023/24 Combined Counties Football League / Cherry Red Records Premier Challenge Cup, aka the League Cup.

AND NOW...

Burnham FC now play in the Cherry Red Records Combined Counties Premier League North. During the Covid-19 pandemic the renamed 1878 stadium and its facilities have undergone a major refurbishment programme. Providing the new chairman, Glenn Skivington, with the chance to achieve one of his key objectives of building closer links with local clubs and the local community. We now have more teams, more clubs and more leagues enjoying the state of the art 3G pitch which was completed in July 2021. Going forward Burnham Football Club will continue to develop as a local sports facility. Creating a pathway for young players, whether they want to play professionally or build a career within the sports industry.

Brief history of Broadfields United FC



Broadfields United Football Club was formed in 1993 at Broadfields Sports and Social Club in Harrow and just a year later had 10 sides running. The 1995/96 season was the first a side participated in the Middlesex County Football League and saw silverware won with the First Team winning the Presidents Cup and a year later they won the Division One title by six points. By the 2001/02 season the club had five teams with the First and Reserve Teams in the Middlesex County League and the remainder playing in Sunday Leagues. This season saw devastation for the club due to the Broadfields fire as our clubhouse burnt to the ground, with just the changing rooms and shower facilities standing.

By 2003/04 there were four teams playing competitively. Firsts still in the Middlesex Premier, and with a Vets side in the London Commercial League. Two Sunday sides were still competing, and over the next few seasons Chris Webster's side managed to win multiple cups over the next few years.

The 2011/12 season saw the First Team side lift silverware for the first time in over a decade as manager Ryan Duffy and assistant Chris Webster, led the team to the Alec Smith Premier Cup trophy over Southall before successfully defending it a year later against British Airways. It was in the 2013/14 season the Reserve Team won both the Senior Reserve Division and the Junior Open Cup, with the season also marking the First team's debut in the FA Vase.

At the end of the 2014/15 season the First Team were promoted to the Spartan South Midlands League Division One and the Reserve Team moved to the Hertfordshire County League Division One. Promotion was secured in a nail-biting finale against Cricklewood Wanderers, in a game that the winners would gain promotion to the SSML, saw an injury time Sam Horan winner seal promotion. The off season also saw one of its players move into the professional game as James Brophy, signed with League One side Swindon Town FC.

In the clubs first season in SSML football, the side reached the semi-final of the League Cup before losing to eventual winners Crawley Green whilst also securing a credible 11th place position in the league. The Sunday side saw the most success from any club side as they completed a terrific quadruple, winning the Harrow Sunday Challenge Premier League, Premier Cup, Champions Cup, and Jack Walker Cup.

The following 2016/17 season saw Mark Barnham, Ryan Duffy and Liam Bird's team clinch a 4-1 win over Borough to secure the Middlesex Premier Cup for the first time. Connor Spinks with two, Rex Kimona and Dene Gardner sealed the result. They managed to reach the second round of the FA Vase. The Reserve Team, now led by Dean Foster, secured promotion to the HCFL Premier Division after undergoing an unbeaten 13 game winning streak which pushed them in to the promotion places.

In 2017/18 a cup double and FA Cup qualification for the first time was secured. In a month where we had 12 matches, we contested two cup finals, first facing landlords Harefield United in the Middlesex Premier Cup at Harrow Borough, and after a close contest we narrowly ran out 1-0 winners courtesy of a Connor Spinks goal. Just four days later we faced fellow SSML Division One side Risborough Rangers for the Spartan League Challenge Trophy at Colney Heath. The first time the final had been contested by two teams outside the Premier Division for over twenty years. We ran out 3-1 victors thanks to goals by Connor Spinks, Sam O'Neill and Dene Gardner. The Reserve Team achieved a mid-table finish in their first season in the Herts Premier and runners up in the Anagram Records Trophy Final.

The end of the 2018/19 season saw the First Team achieve promotion to Step 5 finishing runners up to Harefield United with a tally of 94 points. We were guaranteed as one of the top 9 teams from the 19 leagues at Step 6 and thus achieving promotion to the level for the very first time. The season also saw us compete in our first ever FA Cup game, beating Banstead Athletic 3-0. Unfortunately, the Reserve Team struggled in the league and although they managed to stay up on the last day of the season, the tough decision to withdraw the side in the close season was made.

The new season started brightly with memorable in the league against newly demoted side Dunstable Town 3-0 on the opening day before an impressive 5-1 victory over Combined Counties side, Hanworth Villa in the FA Vase. Post Christmas and in the Middlesex Senior Cup we defeated Conference South side, Hampton & Richmond, 2-1, before exiting the cup in the semi-final away to Bedfont Sports.

The club secured a new groundshare agreement with Tithe Farm Sports & Social Club and Rayners Lane FC which meant a departure from our home for the past 6 seasons, Harefield United. An unusual COVID-19 hit 2020/21 season began with a 3-0 win against Sussex based Loxwood in the opening stage of the FA Cup but in the league only 11 fixtures were played before the season was curtailed.

The following season we reached the Emirates FA Cup Second Round Qualifying for the first time. After Christmas, manager Liam Bird decided to stand down after 5 incredibly successful seasons at the helm and was replaced in the post by David Fox who, along with his backroom team oversaw the running of the side until the end of the season.

A move to the Combined Counties League Premier North Division followed but the new placement meant that a handful of players departed and a rebuild was necessary with many of the 'old guard' not being able to commit any longer with other commitments. The side struggled to find consistency and despite a few good performances the struggles were too much. Ryan Duffy and Sunny Tailor took control in March with the aim of keeping the side in the league and remarkably a 12th place league finish was achieved after ending the season unbeaten in our last 7 games. The season also saw the lifting of silverware, as we won the Middlesex Senior Charity Cup trophy for the first time thanks to a Jordan Greaves goal against Northwood.

Ahead of the 2023/24 season Ryan reverted to a coaching role with Sunny given the managerial role fulltime and the side achieved a 9th placed finish which to date is the clubs highest ever finish. Our Middlesex Senior Charity Cup was defended to the semi-final stage but we were knocked out on penalties after Uxbridge grabbed a late equaliser. In the Senior Cup the highlight of the run was a fixture played against Conference National side Barnet at The Hive and despite being against a side then competing for top place in their league, we fell to a respectable 1-0 defeat.

The 2024/25 campaign did not begin the way we would have hoped. A winless run in our first ten matches left us bottom of the table, facing an uphill battle. However, after an impressive turnaround in form quickly saw us move up the table. The highlight of the season came in the Middlesex Senior Charity Cup, in our second final appearance in three seasons, we overcame Southall at Bedfont Sports Recreation Ground, thanks to a towering Lucas Sinclair header that sealed a 1-0 victory for the club.

As we recharge over the summer, both the backroom team and playing squad have seen some new additions but with a fresh outlook and renewed ambition, we head into the 2025/26 season full of optimism.

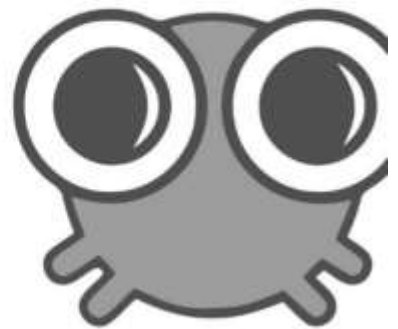

Along with free parking and hospitality, this is the perfect facility for hosting charity matches, corporate football matches or even filming promotional videos. If you would like to book our [3G pitch](#) you can do it using the booking form provided here. Simply tell us your dates and times and we'll talk to you about availability and payment.

If you arrive early, for whatever reason, no problem. You can wait in the Blues Bar or in the outside seating area until your allocated start time. We also ask you to allow enough time before your paid session ends for the hand over. Pitch dimensions

115 yards by 75 yards. The distance of pitch from the dressing rooms is 5 meters.

Important information for players, managers and spectators

For the benefit of the players

We want people to enjoy their time at The 1878 Stadium. If for any reason you forget to bring your boots or Astros, there is a selection of boots in various sizes you can borrow while you are here. Just ask a staff member at pitch side hatch for help.

Sitting or laying on the pitch (unless genuinely injured), wearing flat shoes, trainers, sliders, socks or bear feet has the effect of ironing the grass fibres. Flattening the surface damages the complex water drainage system, causing waterlogging and dramatically reducing the life expectancy of the artificial pitch. Socks only, bear feet, shoes, trainers or sliders with flat soles are NOT permitted – No Excuses! Abusive behaviour towards staff will not be tolerated. If you want to learn why, [click here](#)

- All teams are asked to share permitted footwear guidance prior to match day.
- There are signs strategically positioned explaining the rules.
