### A warm welcome from Burnham FC

Hello and welcome to The 1878 Stadium for this ISUZU FA Vase 3<sup>rd</sup> Round fixture between Burnham and Punjab United (Gravesend).

Our visitors arrive today following a 2-0 home victory over Oakwood, and a 3-1 win, again at home, against Wick. They currently sit in 7<sup>th</sup> place in the Southern Counties East League Premier Division table. They have 26 points from 17 games, and we'd like to thank those who have travelled to support their team today. (*Info correct as at noon on 03/12/2025*)

Burnham won away at Hythe Town on penalties following a 1-1 draw after normal time in the previous round. Before that we beat Spelthorne Sports 3-1 here at The 1878 Stadium. We are  $6^{th}$  in the Combined Counties Football League Premier Division North table with 35 points from 17 games. We're still challenging for a top position in the league with plenty of games in hand.

If this is your first visit there is more useful info on <u>page 6</u>. There is free parking inside the ground, with additional off-site parking available at nearby locations listed on our website and on page 4 of this programme. Please take care not to restrict traffic flow or block driveways if parking outside the ground.

The turnstiles will open approximately 45 minutes before kick-off. Sky Sports and TNT Sports will be on in The Blues Bar & Café. **The visiting team are welcome to wait in the bar until our first team management arrive providing access to the changing rooms.** 

Food and refreshments are available in the bar and inside the Stadium via M&M's hatch and toilets are in the main bar and at the end of the main stand. Please note, the main bar is not accessible from the stadium until half time. Match updates, including line-ups and goal scorers, will be shared on our X and Bluesky profiles. # Match Days at The 1878 Stadium

We welcome visitors to the 1878 Stadium on a regular basis. For some it's a frequent return And for others it's their first time to the ground. The following information provides some useful guidance with links for more information.



#### The 1878 Stadium

Maximum capacity 2,500 including covered seating for 300 in the main stand. There is also a small, covered stand and a concrete path around the 3G pitch. Supporters are not allowed on the pitch and pitch invasions are not permitted.

# A BRIEF HISTORY OF BURNHAM FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1878, <u>Burnham Football Club</u> is the second oldest club Buckinghamshire. We played in the early years, with considerable success, in various leagues, before joining the Great Western Combination in 1948. We moved to the Wycombe Combination in 1964 and then spent one season (1970/71) in the Reading Combination. In 1971 the club was elected to the Hellenic League. Winning both the Premier Division and League Cup in 1975/76. We were also twice beaten finalists in the League Cup too.

In 1977 the club were elected to the Athenian League and were twice runners-up before the league folded in 1984. We competed in the London Spartan League in 1984/85. Winning both the Premier Division title and the League Cup.

The summer of 1985 bought about the amalgamation of the football club with Hillingdon Borough FC, who had lost their ground and were about to fold. We played in the Southern League as Burnham & Hillingdon FC and reverted back to the former name of Burnham FC in 1987. Season 1994/95 saw us finish bottom. Resulting in relegation to the Hellenic League.

After 3 seasons in the Hellenic League, finishing fifth, third and again third in 1998/99. the club won both the Premier Division title and the League Cup. Therefore, gaining promotion back to the Southern Football League. The 2006/07 season saw us achieve our highest league position. Finishing 3rd and thus qualifying for the end of season Promotion Play-Off semi-final. Unfortunately losing to the eventual winners – Swindon Supermarine.

The 2012-2013 season was, without doubt, the most successful in the football club's history. The First Team won the Evo Stik League Southern Division One Central (Southern League) championship. Earning promotion to the newly sponsored Calor League Premier Division (Southern League), while our Reserves won the UHLSPORT Hellenic League Division Two East championship at the first time of asking. Earning promotion to Division One East where they came up against the First Teams of many of the previous season's opposition.

# **CUP COMPETITION HISTORY**

In cup competitions Burnham reached the Quarter Final of the FA Vase in 1977/78 and then went one better in reaching the Semi Final in 1982/83. Losing 4-2 over two legs to Halesowen Town. The clubs record attendance of 2400 was achieved in the home leg. We have twice reached the Third Qualifying round of the FA Cup and in 2005/06 we reached the First Round Proper for the first time ever, before losing at home to Aldershot Town. In the F.A.Trophy we reached the Fourth Round (the last 16) in 1999/2000. Before losing to Scarborough in a replay after a creditable 1-1 draw at The Gore. In the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup we reached the Semi Final twice before losing on both occasions to Chesham United.

On the 22nd May 2024 the blues were successful in beating Virginia Water 2-1 at the Racecourse Ground (Ascot United) and won the 2023/24 Combined Counties Football League / Cherry Red Records Premier Challenge Cup, aka the League Cup.

# AND NOW...

Burnham FC now play in the Cherry Red Records Combined Counties Premier League North. During the Covid-19 pandemic the renamed 1878 stadium and its facilities have undergone a major refurbishment programme. Providing the new chairman, Glenn Skivington, with the chance to achieve one of his key objectives of building closer links with local clubs and the local community. We now have more teams, more clubs and more leagues enjoying the state of the art 3G pitch which was completed in July 2021. Going forward Burnham Football Club will continue to develop as a local sports facility. Creating a pathway for young players, whether they want to play professionally or build a career within the sports industry.

# Brief history of Punjab United FC

Punjab United FC Gravesend. Est. 2003:

Although the club's name may suggest otherwise Punjab United FC is open to members and players 'regardless of age, race, religion, sexual orientation or ability'.

The club first affiliated to the Kent County FA in 2003 as part of current Chairman/Manager Jugjit "Chipie" Sian's, Secretary/Coach Jindi Banwait's, Ajit 'Sonny' Sian's and Navin Pal plan to bring a more entertaining brand of football with an ethical approach to youth and senior football in the Gravesend area. Punjab United started their early years playing in the North Kent Sunday Football League, working up from Division 4. The Sunday side won back-to-back promotions as Div.2 Champions (2006), and Div.1 Runners Up (2007) to the Premier League alongside the Town's more established teams.

Although Silverware at this level eluded us, we had become a club that was being recognised for nurturing talent amongst Gravesend's community-based clubs. We made notable top five placed finishes over the next few seasons, but the thoughts amongst the committee was to move towards Senior football, so we could become sustainable.

As we grew in size, and we started a Sunday reserve side consisting mainly of U21s, the decision to move into Saturday football arrived shortly as the older players of the squad were retiring. Punjab United FC had already begun considerable work on obtaining pitches, and applications, and from 2014/2015 we had played our last games on a Sunday as we took the step to play the talent in the Kent County League.

The club applied for membership to join the Kent County League Premier Division in 2016/2017 where in our only inaugural season we won the Kent Intermediate Challenge Cup, were finalists in the Kent County League Cup, but more importantly being crowned the 2016-2017 League Champions.

Through continuous support and development, both on and off the pitch further success was reached by winning the SCEFL Division.1 title in the 2017/2018 season, sealing unprecedented back-to-back promotions.

We now continue this progression into the SCEFL Premier Division, and hope your continued support will guide us with yet more success through the National Non-League System.

The biggest highlight since being a Step.5 club has been our 6-0 win vs Deal Town in the 2022/2023 Kent Senior Trophy Final.

We have significantly progressed our Youth and Mini-Soccer teams, representing age groups from U7s to U23s; including a SCEFL Development side, and links to NTC Academy who will represent the club in the F.A. Youth Cup this year.

Our male Youth teams represent the Kent Youth League, North Kent Youth League, and South East London & Kent League. With a girls side also in the Kent Girls and Ladies Football League.



# Important information for players, managers and spectators

### For the benefit of the players

We want people to enjoy their time at The 1878 Stadium. If for any reason you forget to bring your boots or Astros, there is a selection of boots in various sizes you can borrow while you are here. Just ask a staff member at pitch side hatch for help.

Sitting or laying on the pitch (unless genuinely injured), wearing flat shoes, trainers, sliders, socks or bear feet has the effect of ironing the grass fibres. Flattening the surface damages the complex water drainage system, causing waterlogging and dramatically reducing the life expectancy of the artificial pitch. Socks only, bear feet, shoes, trainers or sliders with flat soles are NOT permitted – No Excuses! Abusive behaviour towards staff will not be tolerated. If you want to learn why, click here

- All teams are asked to share permitted footwear guidance prior to match day.
- There are signs strategically positioned explaining the rules.

# Why Being There Still Matters: The Case for Live Non-League Football

In an age when football is on television almost every night of the week, it's easy to see why many supporters choose the sofa over the stadium. Every channel and streaming service offers wall-to-wall coverage of the <u>Premier League</u>, Champions League and international fixtures — all in high definition, complete with replays, commentary and statistics at your fingertips.

But while televised football brings the game closer to millions, it has also made it harder for smaller, community-based clubs to compete for attention. When you can flick on the TV and watch your favourite stars at the click of a button, the pull of live non-league football can be overlooked. Yet those who've spent an evening or an afternoon at The 1878 Stadium watching <a href="Burnham FC's first team">Burnham FC's first team</a> know that what we offer can't be replicated through a screen.

Televised matches are convenient — you can stay warm, grab a snack, and watch world-class players perform. But it's a one-way experience. You can't feel the cold night air, hear the shouts from the bench, or sense the raw emotion of a goal that means everything to the players and supporters. Non-league football gives you that. It's unpredictable, passionate, and real. You're not 100 yards away from the pitch — you're right on top of the action.

There's also something special about the connection between supporters and players at this level. You can chat to them before the game, congratulate them in person, and share time together. That sense of belonging and togetherness is what football was built on — and it's alive and well in non-league.

Of course, watching from home will always have its place. Not everyone can make every game, and televised matches keep fans engaged with the wider sport. But the soul of football lives in the stands, not on the screen. The sound of the whistle, the crunch of a tackle, the smell of hot food from M&Ms — these are the moments that remind us why we fell in love with the game.

So next time you're deciding between another televised fixture and a trip down to The 1878 Stadium, remember: nothing beats being there. Come and experience the game as it's meant to be — live, local and full of heart.
