A warm welcome from Burnham FC

Happy New Year and welcome to The 1878 Stadium for this festive Combined Counties Football League Premier Division North fixture between Burnham and Ardley United.

Ardley United arrive at The 1878 Stadium sitting third in the league table with 41 points from 19 matches, having recorded 13 victories so far this season. While they have enjoyed a strong campaign, Burnham will take confidence from our FA Cup victory over today's visitors back in August — even if plenty has changed since then. Our own form has continued to build momentum. We currently sit fourth in the table, level on 41 points with Ardley United despite having played two more games. Since our narrow FA Vase defeat to Punjab United, this group has shown real resilience, grinding out results in matches that may have slipped away from us last season. Today represents a big opportunity. With both sides fighting at the sharp end of the table, three points are firmly in our sights as we look to continue our push towards the top and make home advantage count.

There is free parking inside the ground, with additional off-site parking available at nearby locations listed on our website and on page 4 of this programme. Please take care not to restrict traffic flow or block driveways if parking outside the ground.

The turnstiles will open approximately 45 minutes before kick-off. Sky Sports and TNT Sports will be on in The Blues Bar & Café. **The visiting team are welcome to wait in the bar until our first team management arrive providing access to the changing rooms.**

Food and refreshments are available in the bar and inside the Stadium via M&M's hatch and toilets are in the main bar and at the end of the main stand. Please note, the main bar is not accessible from the stadium until half time. Match updates, including line-ups and goal scorers, will be shared on our X and Bluesky profiles. The 1878 Stadium

Maximum capacity 2,500 including covered seating for 300 in the main stand. There is also a small, covered stand and a concrete path around the 3G pitch. Supporters are not allowed on the pitch and pitch invasions are not permitted.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF BURNHAM FOOTBALL CLUB

Founded in 1878, <u>Burnham Football Club</u> is the second oldest club Buckinghamshire. We played in the early years, with considerable success, in various leagues, before joining the Great Western Combination in 1948. We moved to the Wycombe Combination in 1964 and then spent one season (1970/71) in the Reading Combination. In 1971 the club was elected to the Hellenic League. Winning both the Premier Division and League Cup in 1975/76. We were also twice beaten finalists in the League Cup too.

In 1977 the club were elected to the Athenian League and were twice runners-up before the league folded in 1984. We competed in the London Spartan League in 1984/85. Winning both the Premier Division title and the League Cup.

The summer of 1985 bought about the amalgamation of the football club with Hillingdon Borough FC, who had lost their ground and were about to fold. We played in the Southern League as Burnham & Hillingdon FC and reverted back to the former name of Burnham FC in 1987. Season 1994/95 saw us finish bottom. Resulting in relegation to the Hellenic League.

After 3 seasons in the Hellenic League, finishing fifth, third and again third in 1998/99. the club won both the Premier Division title and the League Cup. Therefore, gaining promotion back to the Southern Football League. The 2006/07 season saw us achieve our highest league position. Finishing 3rd and thus qualifying for the end of season Promotion Play-Off semi-final. Unfortunately losing to the eventual winners – Swindon Supermarine.

The 2012-2013 season was, without doubt, the most successful in the football club's history. The First Team won the Evo Stik League Southern Division One Central (Southern League) championship. Earning promotion to the newly sponsored Calor League Premier Division (Southern League), while our Reserves won the UHLSPORT Hellenic League Division Two East championship at the first time of asking. Earning promotion to Division One East where they came up against the First Teams of many of the previous season's opposition.

CUP COMPETITION HISTORY

In cup competitions Burnham reached the Quarter Final of the FA Vase in 1977/78 and then went one better in reaching the Semi Final in 1982/83. Losing 4-2 over two legs to Halesowen Town. The clubs record attendance of 2400 was achieved in the home leg. We have twice reached the Third Qualifying round of the FA Cup and in 2005/06 we reached the First Round Proper for the first time ever, before losing at home to Aldershot Town. In the F.A.Trophy we reached the Fourth Round (the last 16) in 1999/2000. Before losing to Scarborough in a replay after a creditable 1-1 draw at The Gore. In the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup we reached the Semi Final twice before losing on both occasions to Chesham United.

On the 22nd May 2024 the blues were successful in beating Virginia Water 2-1 at the Racecourse Ground (Ascot United) and won the 2023/24 Combined Counties Football League / Cherry Red Records Premier Challenge Cup, aka the League Cup.

AND NOW...

Burnham FC now play in the Cherry Red Records Combined Counties Premier League North. During the Covid-19 pandemic the renamed 1878 stadium and its facilities have undergone a major refurbishment programme. Providing the new chairman, Glenn Skivington, with the chance to achieve one of his key objectives of building closer links with local clubs and the local community. We now have more teams, more clubs and more leagues enjoying the state of the art 3G pitch which was completed in July 2021. Going forward Burnham Football Club will continue to develop as a local sports facility. Creating a pathway for young players, whether they want to play professionally or build a career within the sports industry.

Brief history of Ardley United FC

Ardley United were formed in 1945 just after the end of the Second World War.

In the early years, the club plied its trade in the Lord Jersey FA and played on a pitch which was situated close to the railway line on the Oxford Road. The 1950's and '60's were successful for the club as they won both league titles and cups; most notably the Oxfordshire Junior Shield on three occasions as well as many other trophies. The acquisition of the current Playing Field site in the mid-60's enabled the club to move into the heart of the village, and a number of volunteers led by lifelong supporter Doug Hodges built modest changing rooms. Ardley continued to compete in the Jersey League throughout the 70's and early 80's without much success but this was to change in the mid-'80's with the arrival of Norman Stacey as chairman.

In 1988 the club were promoted to the Oxfordshire Senior League and won the Division One title at the first attempt, following this up with the Premier Division title the following season. Accepting a place in the Hellenic League for the 1993/4 season, Ardley spent six seasons in the 'old' Division One winning it in both 1996/7 and 1997/8 as well as winning the Division 1 Cup for a record four consecutive seasons before it was merged with the Premier Division Cup to become the Challenge Cup that we know today. The manager during those years was ex-Oxford United leading scorer Peter Foley and he was to be the first in a line of managers to keep Ardley at the forefront; they were Paul Spittle, Paul Berry, Dan Still and Kevin Brock.

Major change was to come in the early 2000's as, along with the Ardley Playing Field Committee, Ardley United oversaw the construction of dedicated facilities, along with a separate village hall, which enabled the club to be independent of community activities. The new clubhouse, which had been awarded the Non-League Paper's Hungerford Cup for most-improved facilities, allowed the club to be promoted to the Hellenic Premier Division and so began the club's most successful years to date. Kevin Brock took the reins for seven seasons which saw Ardley win several cups, including the Oxfordshire Senior Cup in 2013/14, a season during which they narrowly lost out on the Premier Division title by just two points.

Following Brock's departure, Paul Davis took over as manager for nearly two seasons until the resignation of long-time chairman, Norman Stacey in June 2017, due to personal reasons. Ian Feaver took over the role of Chairman and appointed Craig Adey as First Team Manager. A decision to be voluntarily relegated to Uhlsport Hellenic League Division One West gave everyone some breathing space to adjust to the new regime. Craig brought with him a talented squad of players and they won the Division title and gaining promotion back to the Premier Division at the first time of asking. The 2018/2019 season had its ups and downs, however, the team finished on a high winning the Hellenic League Floodlit Cup.

In 2021 we wanted to take the next leap and therefore appointed Julian McCalmon as our manager. Jules brought in some top quality players for our level and we became more competitive. Jules was our manager for 4 seasons, with the first 2 being in the South Midlands Spartan League and the last 2 in the Combined Counties North. We became a solid mid table team and made it to 3 cup finals, including beating Oxford United on the way to the County Cup final. Unfortunately we were runners up, but we had taken great strides. Jules resigned at the end of last season and we took the opportunity to promote his assistant, Mark Massingham to be our current manager. Mark has built a great management team, with Gavin James as his assistant and Luke Quarterman and Darren Thomas, as well as Bowie Price being retained as our physio. Massy has made some excellent signings and built a squad that we want to see break into a top 5 position this year.



<u>Burnham Football Club</u> has invested heavily in a FIFA Certified state-of-the-art 3G artificial pitch. Along with free parking and hospitality, this is the perfect facility for hosting charity matches, corporate football matches or even filming promotional videos. If you would like to book our <u>3G pitch</u> you can do it using the booking form provided here. Simply tell us your dates and times and we'll talk to you about availability and payment.

If you arrive early, for whatever reason, no problem. You can wait in the Blues Bar or in the outside seating area until your allocated start time. We also ask you to allow enough time before your paid session ends for the hand over. Pitch dimensions

115 yards by 75 yards. The distance of pitch from the dressing rooms is 5 meters.

Important information for players, managers and spectators

We have VERY strict rules regarding permitted footwear when anyone enters the pitch enclosure. Rules that apply to players, those in the dugouts and supporters who, for example, want to take photos. Please read – Permitted Footwear at The 1878 Stadium, Burnham Football Club

For the benefit of the players

We want people to enjoy their time at The 1878 Stadium. If for any reason you forget to bring your boots or Astros, there is a selection of boots in various sizes you can borrow while you are here. Just ask a staff member at pitch side hatch for help.

Sitting or laying on the pitch (unless genuinely injured), wearing flat shoes, trainers, sliders, socks or bear feet has the effect of ironing the grass fibres. Flattening the surface damages the complex water drainage system, causing waterlogging and dramatically reducing the life expectancy of the artificial pitch. Socks only, bear feet, shoes, trainers or sliders with flat soles are NOT permitted – No Excuses! Abusive behaviour towards staff will not be tolerated. If you want to learn why, click here

Please be aware:

- All teams are asked to share permitted footwear guidance prior to match day.
- There are signs strategically positioned explaining the rules.
- Our pitch, our rules Ignorance is no excuse.

What's the difference between a 3G and 4G pitch?

We, namely the staff and volunteers at <u>Burnham Football Club</u>, are often asked to clarify the difference between 3rd Generation (3G) and 4th Generation (4G) pitches. Specifically the use of artificial surfaces for football here in the UK.

Our traditional grass football pitch was replaced with a new 3G artificial pitch during the summer of 2021. We took the decision to use a black rubber crumb infill rather than sand and continue to undertake regular maintenance to keep the surface in tip top condition for all who play on it.

The FA and therefore their related leagues require all 3G football pitches to have a valid FIFA certification and here's the main register of 3G pitches for England hosted by <u>The Football Foundation</u>. The following statement can be found on page 5 of the <u>The FA Third Generation Football Turf Guidance</u> PDF document:

At the moment there is no such thing as 4G or 5G, terms sometimes used by sales-people. Some manufacturers may promote non-infilled products, but these have not received acceptance as a suitable football surface and often struggle to satisfy FIFA requirements.

It's also important to note that, in our opinion, the use of the phrase 'All-Weather' is also another 'sales' term. Artificial pitches can indeed withstand a variety of weather conditions including rain and frost. However, a match may still be postponed because of heavy snow fall and using a brush or drag mat to clear snow can result in crumb displacement. If you would like to know more, speak to a supplier, for example <u>Velocity Sports</u>.
